For a cozier feeling, use darker, high intensity, warm colors that coordinate with the items you already have in the room. You can also add splashes of an accent color to a room using accessories. For example, if your accent color is red-orange, place a redorange vase on the coffee table, a redorange throw on the chair, and a piece of art on the wall with red-orange in it. With rooms that are open to each other, try bringing your accent color into both rooms for a feeling of cohesiveness. Adding color to your rooms would be like lavishing your home with a sparkling diamond heart necklace for Valentine's Day!
